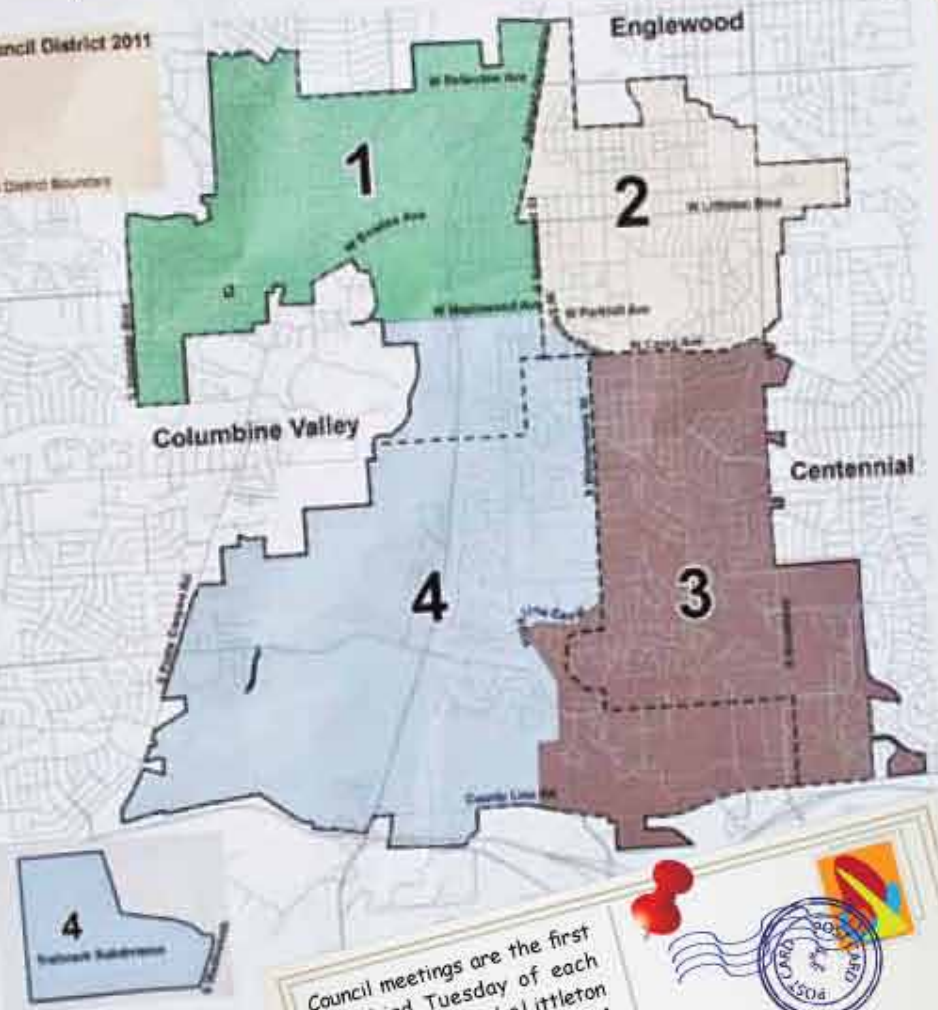

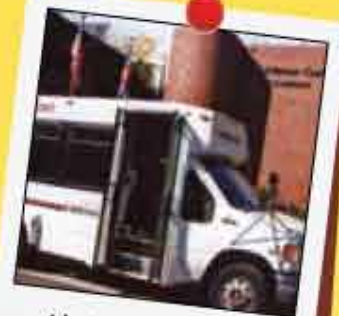

Economic Gardening program is an approach to economic development that focuses on growing jobs by nurturing local entrepreneurs. The program provides free, high-end, corporate-level tools for all Littleton businesses including search engine optimization, social media, and using geographic information systems to create customized mapping of customer data, demographics, trade areas, supply/demand ratios and more. In a typical year, the B/IA staff have contact with up to 400 businesses. The results of the program are impressive. From 1990 to 2010, the job base in Littleton increased from 15,000 to 27,000.
